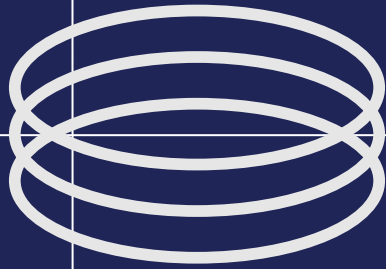

Welcome to PicassO-Week.

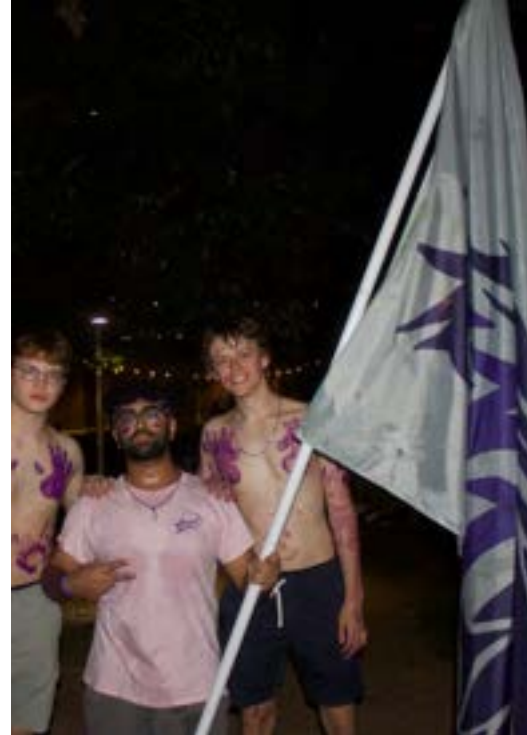
MISSION STATEMENT

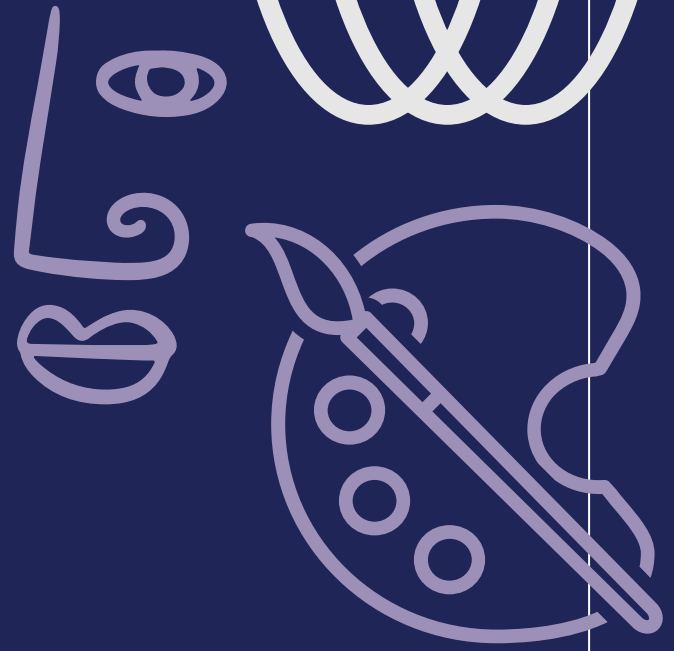

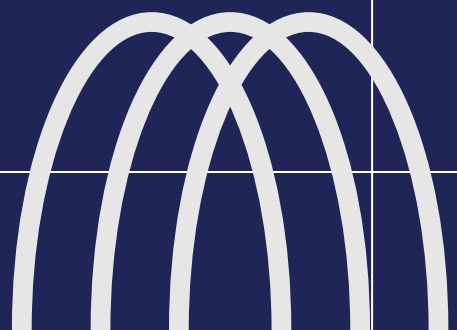
Although only you can decide how to make your mark at Rice University, remember that you will now always have a place in the gallery we call home: McMurtry.

Move-In Day Instructions



Plan to arrive in the morning on Sunday, August 17th. When you arrive at Rice, please enter through Entrance #1 (the main entrance), take your first right, and follow the signs for McMurry. After you unload, you will be given directions for where to park for the remainder of the morning. As you get closer to McMurry, Advisors will be holding signs, yelling your name, and welcoming you to the college. They are super excited to meet you!

Your Advisors, and maybe some helpful football players, will empty your car and start moving your stuff into the building (that's right - you don't have to do ANY work). In the meantime, you and your family will be introduced to our wonderful College Coordinator, Jackie, who will give you your keys and other important information. After you check that all your belongings are in your room, you will meet the McTeam (our amazing Core Team), who will welcome you to McMurry and Rice. They are so excited to meet you and you can read more about them later in this book! You will also have some time to unpack and begin setting up your room.

Around noon, there will be lunch for you, your family, and your Advisors. Soon after lunch, it will be time to say a final goodbye to your family, and head off to join your O-Week group for the first time. While your family and loved ones stay behind for a New Families Orientation, you will be starting one of the most jam-packed and fun-filled weeks of your college career!

Directions to McMurtry

Arriving By Car:

From the West on I-10 East:

Take 610 South to 59 North and exit at Greenbriar. Follow Greenbriar and turn left at Rice Boulevard. Follow until it becomes Sunset Blvd. Turn right on Main Street and take an immediate right into Rice campus using Entrance #1.

From the East on I-10 West:

Take the US 59 South exit. From US 59 South, take the Fannin Street exit and travel south on Fannin until you reach Sunset Boulevard. Take a right on Sunset and an immediate left onto Main Street. Turn right onto Rice campus using Entrance #1.

From the South on US-59 North:

Exit at Greenbriar, stay on the frontage road, and turn right (south) on Greenbriar. Follow Greenbriar to the light at Rice Boulevard. Turn left onto Rice Boulevard. Stay on Rice Boulevard until it becomes Sunset. Turn right on Main Street and take an immediate right into Rice campus using Entrance #1.

From the North on US-59 South:

Take the Fannin Street exit and travel south on Fannin until you reach Sunset Boulevard. Take a right on Sunset and an immediate left onto Main Street. Turn right into Rice campus using Entrance #1.

Arriving By Plane:

George Bush Intercontinental Airport (IAH):

Supershuttle (713-523-8888 or supershuttle.com) provides services to and from Intercontinental and the fare is \$27. All departures are from the lower level baggage claim (southside area) where they have agents on duty. The shuttle departs every 30 minutes beginning at 6:10 am and takes 45 minutes to an hour. The express will take you to a Holiday Inn in the Medical Center (about five minutes from Rice). Normal Supershuttle can be requested to stop at Rice. Another option is Uber. Depending on what time of day you arrive, Uber will cost around \$40 and can be called at any time.

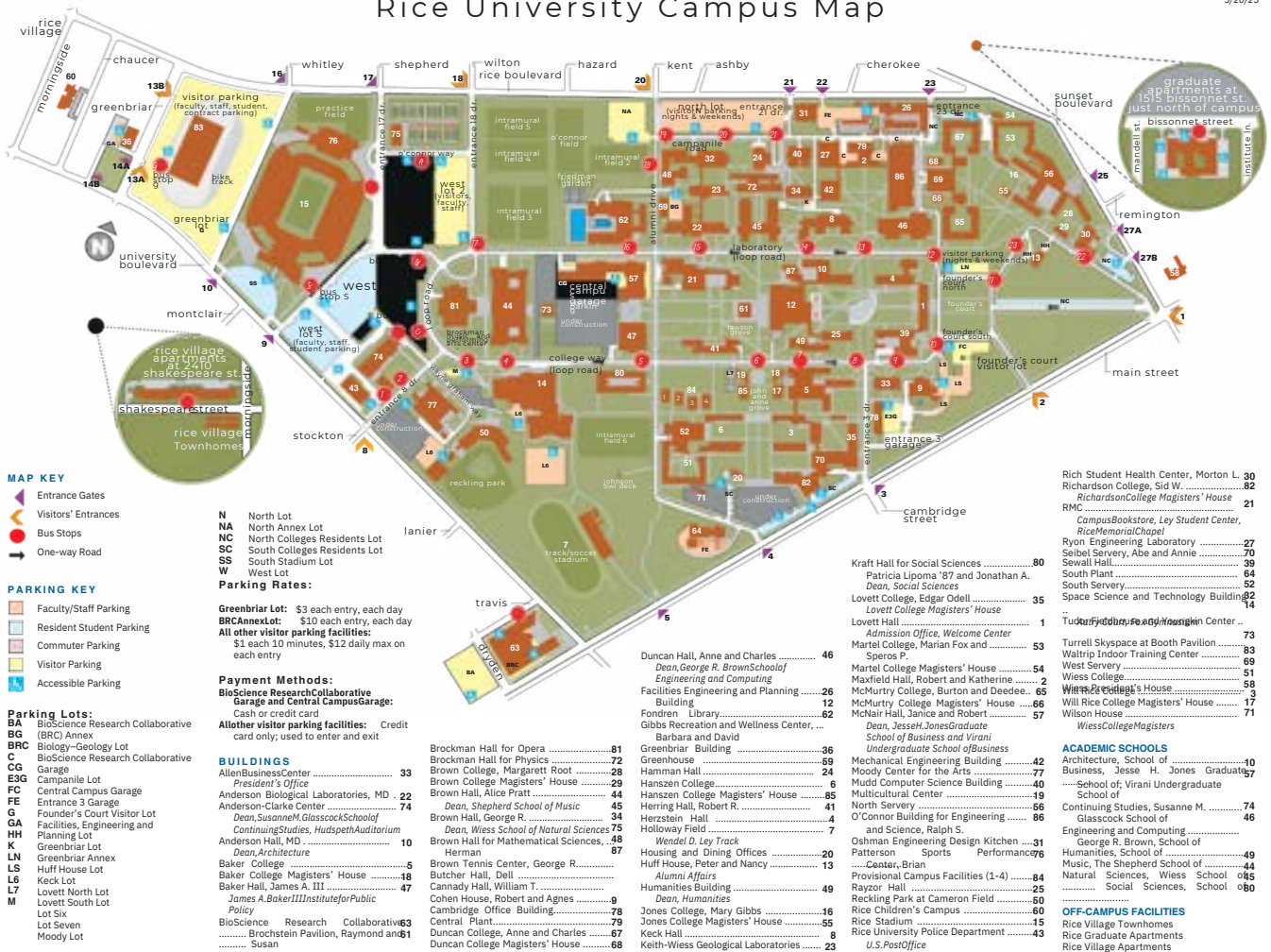
Houston Hobby Airport (HOU):

The Airport Express also runs to the Medical Center and also leaves every 30 minutes starting at 6:10 am. The fare is \$20 and will take 30-45 minutes. Supershuttle is also available at Hobby Airport and costs around \$20. Another option is Uber. Depending on what time of day you arrive, Uber will cost around \$40 as well and can be called at any time.

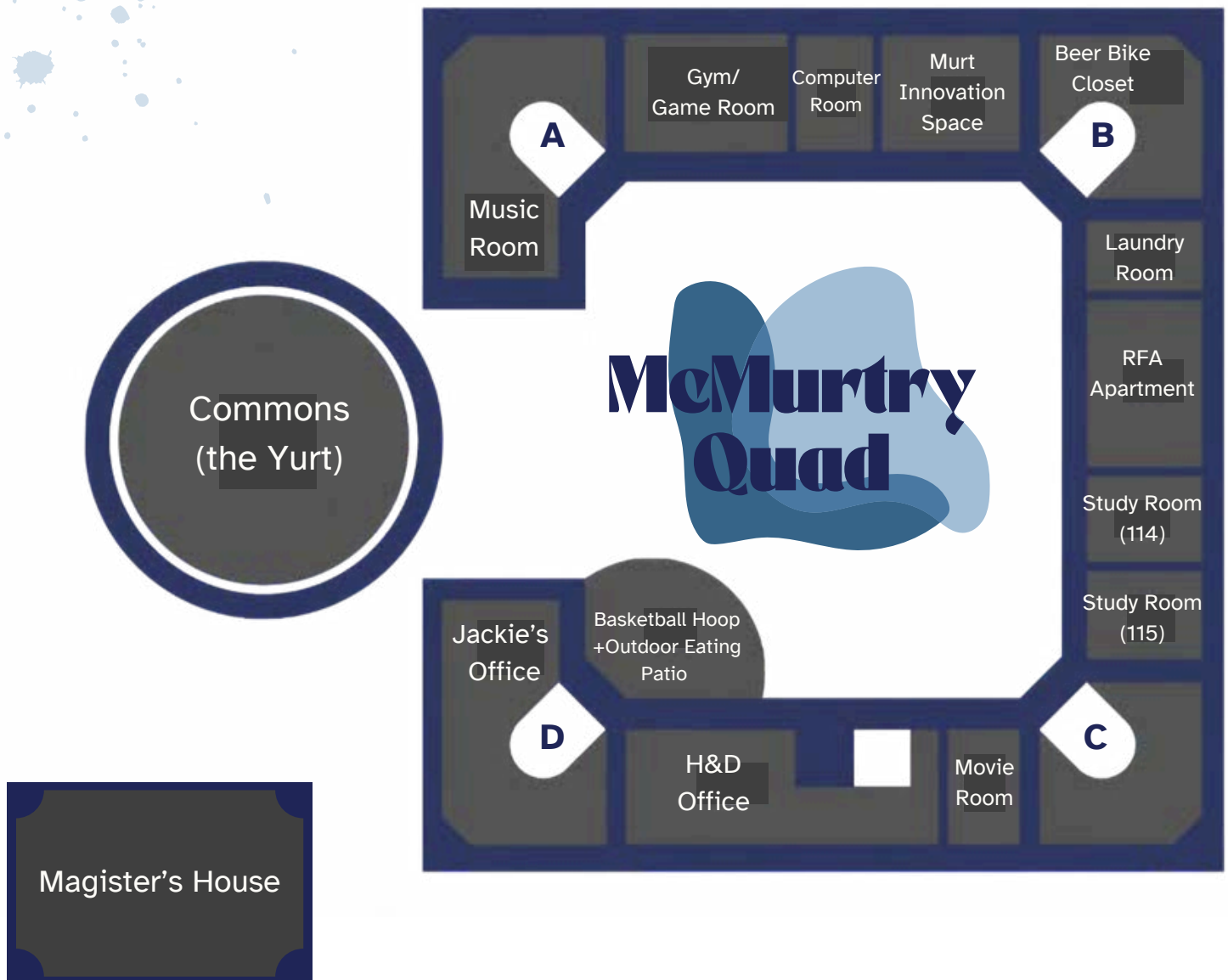

First Floor

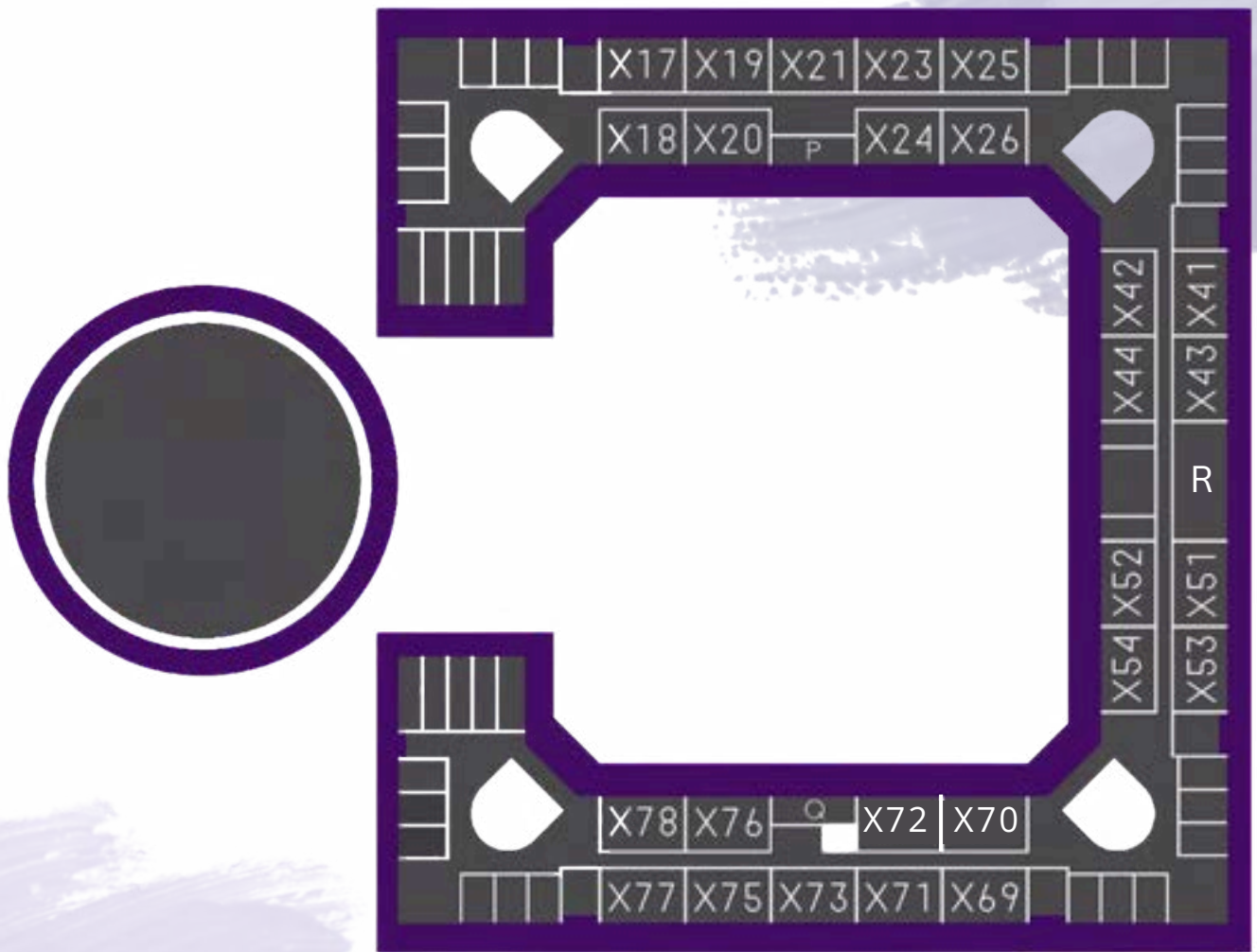


A,B,C, and D denote our four stairways. You will often hear Murts say things like "meet me by stair B" or "leaving from stair D."

Aside from some RFAs, no one lives on the ground (or 1st) floor. You will find essentials like our Laundry Room, Study Rooms, and Jackie's Office!

A few steps from the main McMurtry building is our Commons, the Yurt, connected to West Servery. You will always find Murts eating meals, studying, and hanging out here; many Murt events also take place in the Yurt!

Map of McMurtry



McMurtry: 2nd, 3rd, and 4th floors

Replace “X” with your floor to find your room on the map above!

All incoming Murts living on campus will be assigned to a room on the 2nd, 3rd, or 4th floor.

P - denotes a small communal study room-type space where there is a table, chairs, and a whiteboard.

Q - denotes a kitchen space containing a stove/oven, sink, microwave, and fridge! Anyone is welcome to use these at any time as long as they clean up afterward.

R - denotes an RA apartment on the 2nd and 3rd floors (Tamara and Deirdre, respectively)

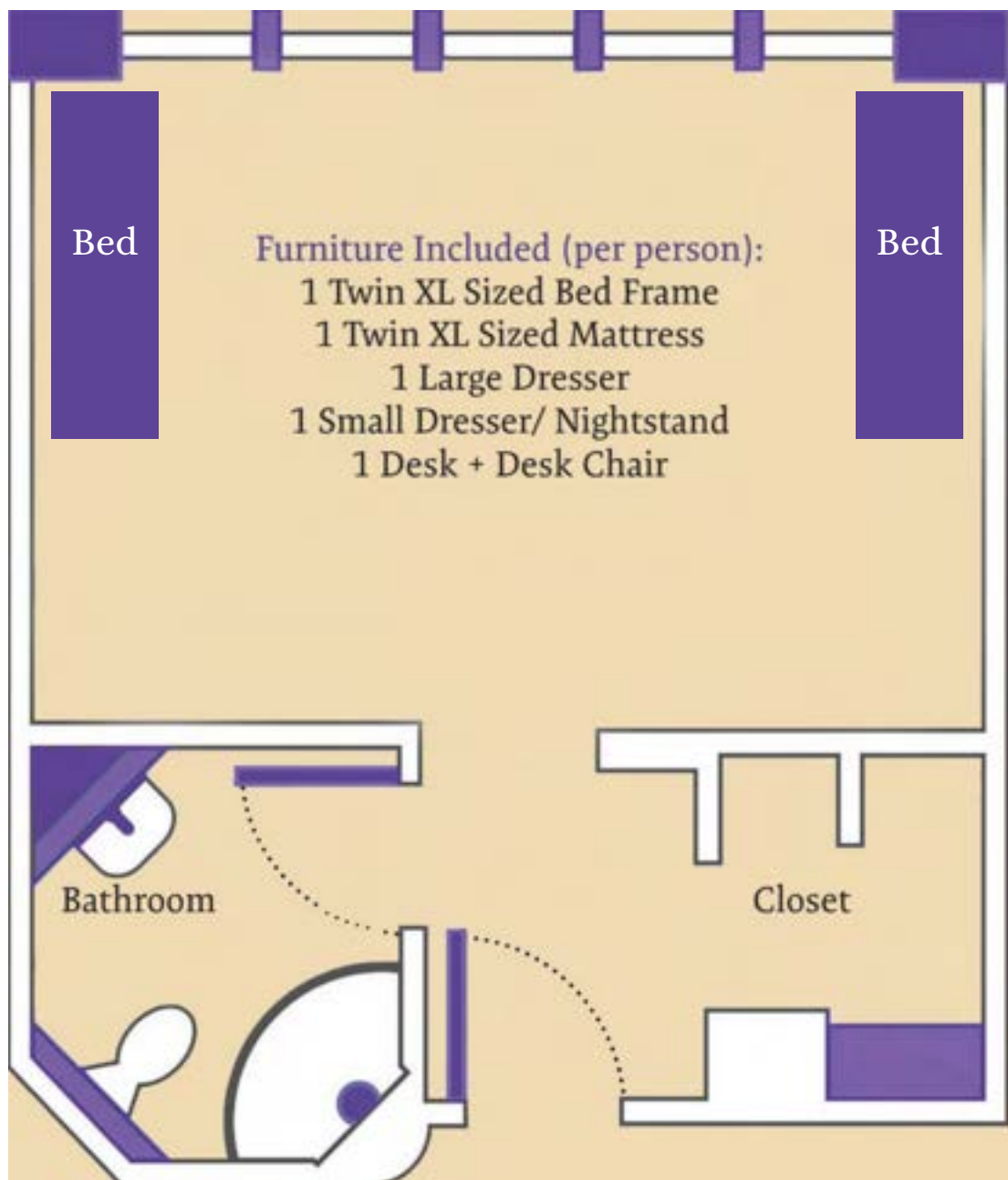
McMurtry 5th is a sundeck where some upperclassmen live and are also home to 2 more communal lounge spaces, and sometimes Murt-wide events are hosted up here!

Hall Culture - Rooms above the A & B staircase (x17 - x44) are “O” halls (stands for Orange), and rooms above the C & D staircase (x51 - x78) are “Y” halls (stands for Yellow).

Your Room

Coming in as New Students to McMurtry, you will most likely be placed in a double (one room shared between two people) with your roommate.

The diagram below is a floor plan which should give you an idea of what your 18'x18' room will look like!

Congratulations and welcome to Rice University and McMurtry College! We are thrilled to have you join our family. Know that you should be proud of how far you've come in your educational journey. We acknowledge the grit and resilience, it has taken for you to be here, and we embrace your perspective and life experiences in our community. College is the next big step in your life, and although this task can seem daunting, we have a few set of tips to help you navigate this journey as an undocumented student:

First, remember that your status is YOUR status. Whether you feel comfortable sharing this part of your identity or not, it is completely okay and your sole decision. Regardless of the route you decide to take, know that your perspective is still valued in and outside of the classroom. Whether it's discussing DACA, or fostering a community of support, we encourage you to serve in as active of a role you feel comfortable in. Know that even through direct and indirect advocacy, we can create an equitable experience for future undocumented Rice students. Second, pursue your passions wholeheartedly here at Rice. Whether you want to do research, advocacy work, or volunteer, you have the resources and opportunity to accomplish these goals.

Don't be afraid to reach out to the Center for Career and Development (CCD), to learn what opportunities are available to you as an undocumented student. Once you learn more information, share it with your fellow networks who might also be seeking answers to the same questions. Ultimately, we still have a lot of control over the opportunities we unlock and the direction in which our lives go.

Some resources/opportunities we recommend during your time at Rice:

Undocumented Student Support Services Task Force (IG: undocu.rice): The task force is a student-run club dedicated to providing undocumented students with a safe space for advocacy and community. They offer free appointments with immigration firms, anonymous Q&A sessions, and post-grad alumni panels.

Center for Civic Leadership (CCL): The CCL has a variety of Houston-based programs that allow non-citizens to participate in semester, year-long, or summer projects. This includes Alternative Spring Break, Gulf Scholars Program, Houston Policy Experience, Houston Action Research Team, Leadership Rice Mentorship Experience, and the Rich Family Endowment.

Research Stipends: Rice loves for its students to be involved in research and compensation is as equally of important. Talk with your Research supervisor to discuss possible stipend and payment options.

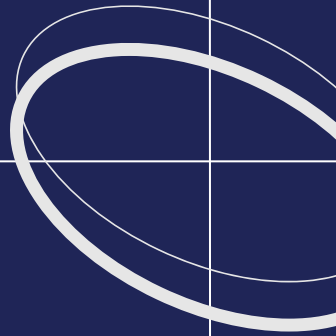
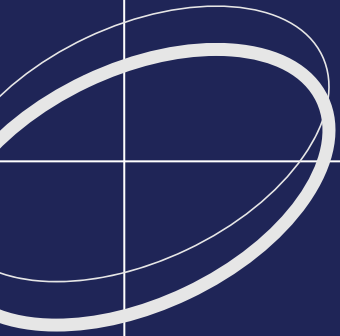
Dear New Students,

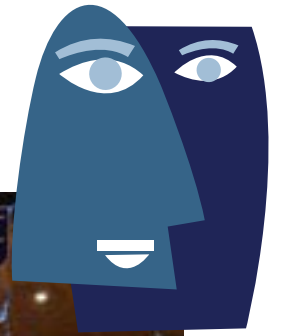
McRice

Sundae Sundays

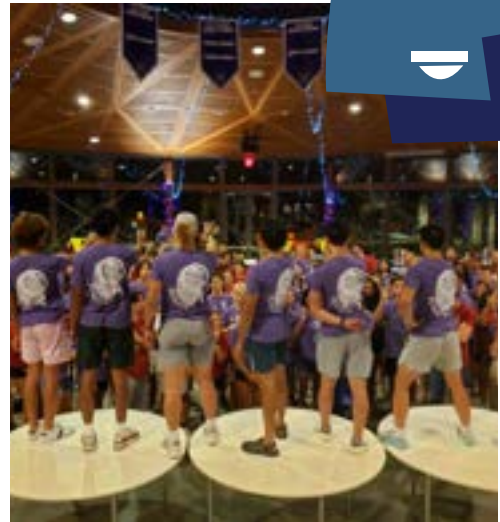

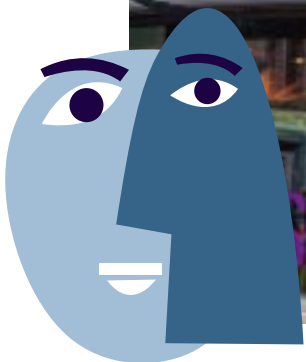


Cookie Defense

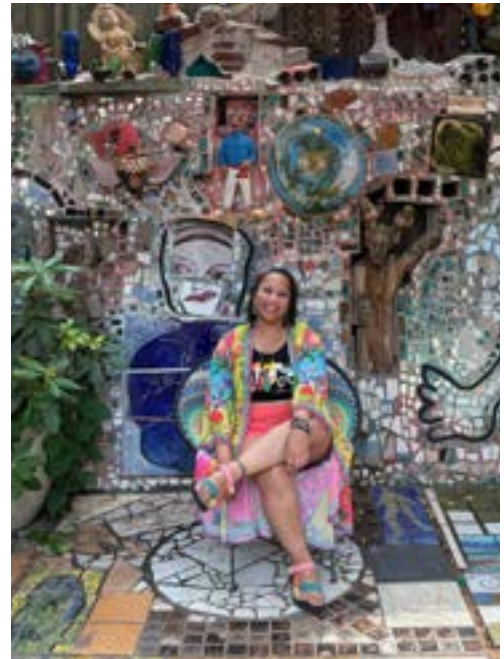


Residential Associate

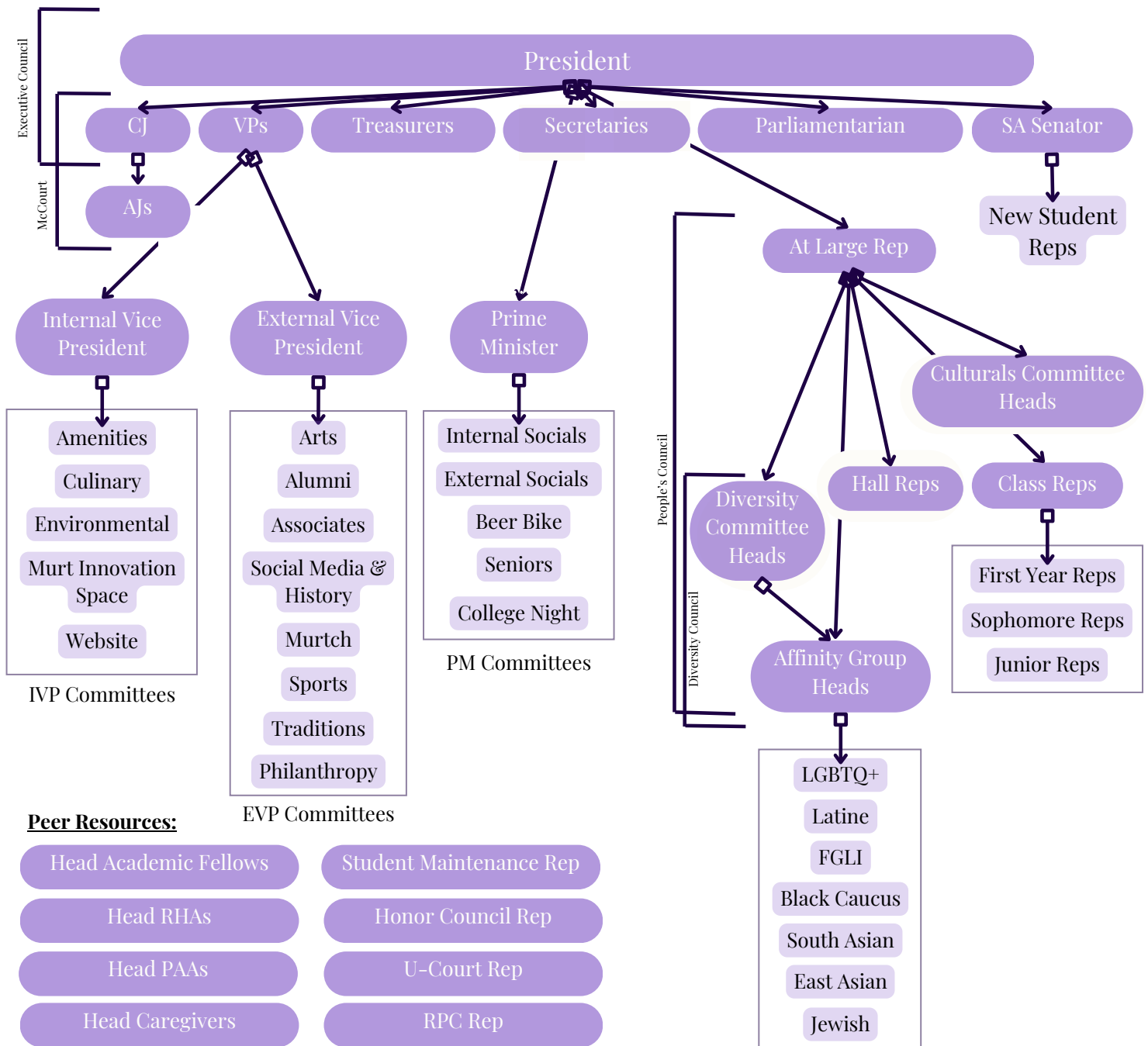

McMurtry Government

At Rice, all 11 colleges have an internal, student-run government designed to deal with various aspects of the college. At McMurtry, our student government is known as the McMinistry. The McMinistry contains the Executive Council (EC), which includes the President, Chief Justice, Internal and External VPs, Prime Minister, At-Large Representative, Secretaries, Treasurers, Parliamentarian, and SA Senator. The EC conducts various functions, including overseeing the committee system, advocating for ideas and initiatives, creating and managing the budget, and much more. In addition to the EC, the At-Large Rep serves as the head of the People's Council (PC) and represents the interests of McMurtry College as a whole. The PC includes 9 Hall Reps, 9 Class Reps, and the Diversity and Cultural committee heads. The Class Reps include three First Year Reps who are elected in the fall (and you can be one!). Many of the events that are planned for McMurtry students are organized through the various committees. Getting involved in a committee is a great (and easy) way to get involved with the McGovernment. 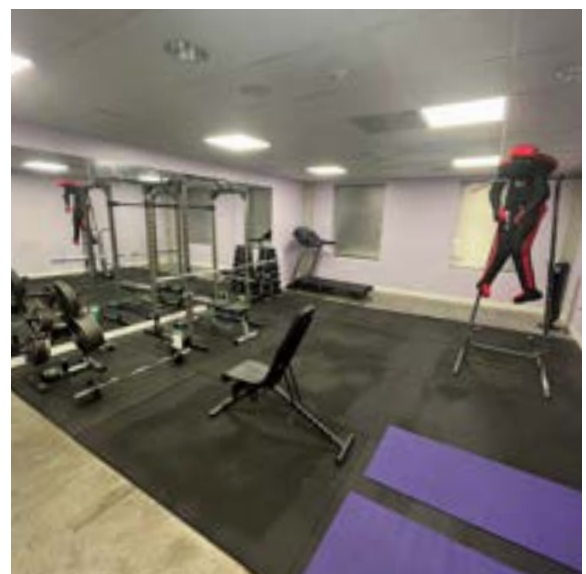
Quad

Movie Room

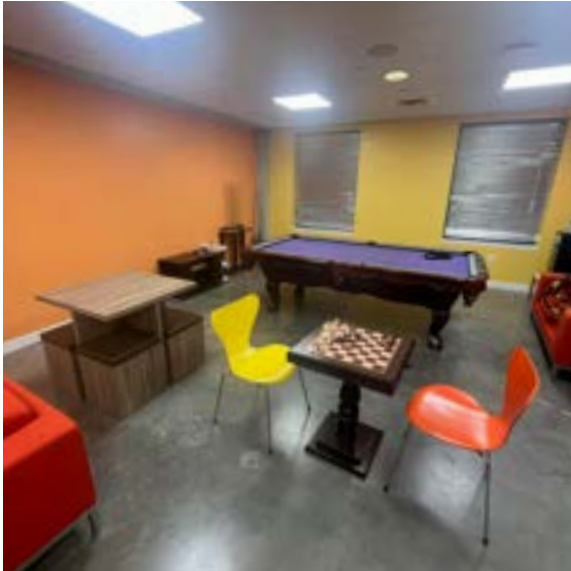
Study Room 120 is actually our very own movie room! The room comes with couches and a TV available for hosting fun movie nights with friends.



Gym

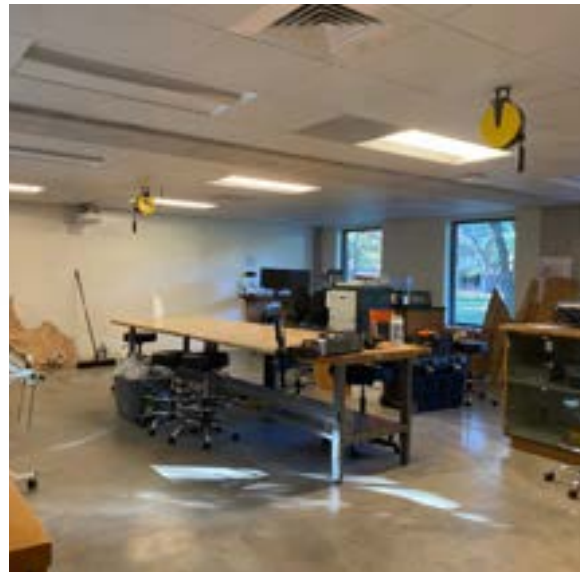

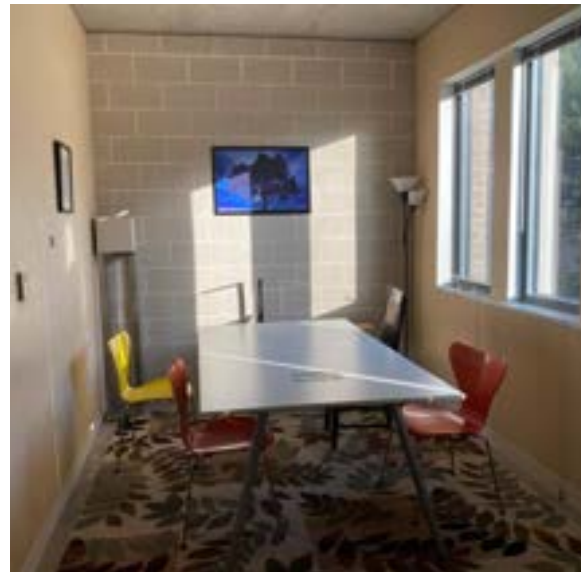


Study Rooms

McMurtry has two study rooms on the ground floor and one on each of the higher floors. Each study room offers a table and whiteboard for Murts to catch up on some work.

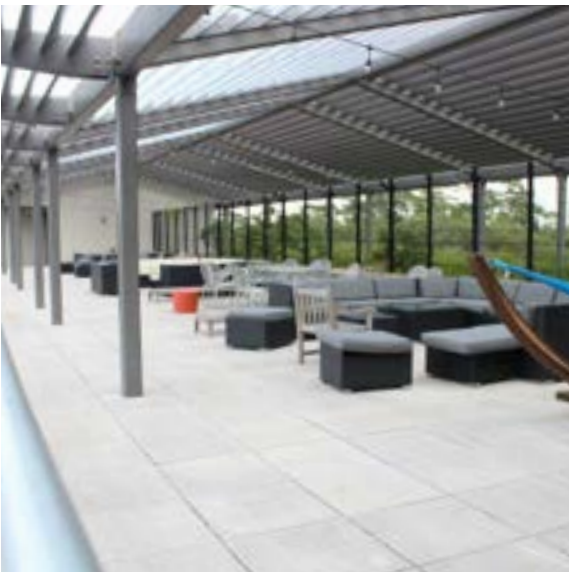
Library & Private Dining Room

The McMurtry Library and Private Dining Room (PDR) are spaces located above West Serverly, often used for quiet studying or club events.



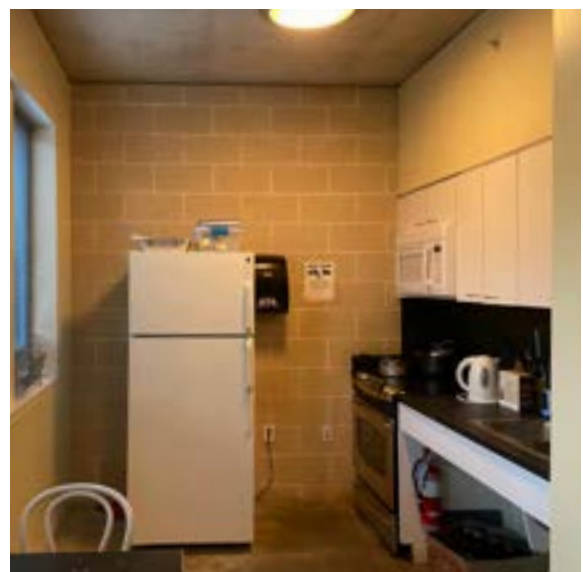
5th Floor

The rooms on 5th floor are reserved for upperclassmen, but the top floor sundeck offers a nice space for all Murts to hang out outside.



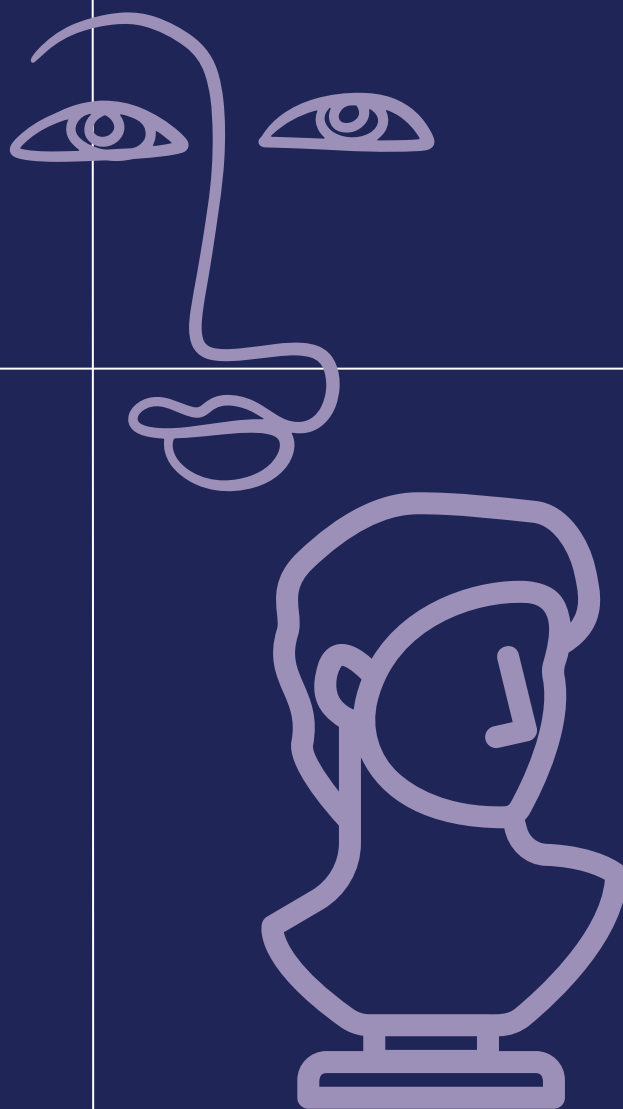
Kitchens

Vocabulary

Associate Justice (AJ): They help out with the justice system and alcohol policy regulations; are under the CJs.

Associates Night: A formal dinner held in your college's commons once a semester to connect with the Associates.

Beer Bike: A very competitive, inter-college, GSA, and alumni race/event held every spring, in which eight bikers and eight chuggers from each college compete for personal and college pride.

Birthday Gong: A beautiful, golden gong located in the Yurt and carved with the McM crest that people ring on their birthday.

Burt's Teahouse (Burt's): A McMurtry communal kitchen on 5th Floor, with free tea and mugs available for all Murts.

Chaus: A nickname for Rice Coffeehouse, a student-run business located in the RMC.

Chug: One-half of the Beer Bike race, often preceded by one of Rice's most sacred chants: "They're forty yards out, they're thirty yards out, ready, set chug chug chug chug...!"

Chief Justice (CJ): They're in charge of making sure Murts stay safe, so they're experts on the justice system and alcohol policy. They're who you go to for registering your parties!

College Night: Not just a night, but actually a full day of themed celebration and partying held every semester, with each college celebrating their own College Night.

Conch: Whenever you hear this beautiful instrument trumpeted, know that it is time to rally and show the other colleges our Murt pride!

Deedee's Lounge: Located on 5th floor, this room is a common space for people to watch TV or play video games. It is also home of our biweekly Sunday Sundaes event.

Fellow: Murts who are dedicated to helping other Murts academically in various subjects.

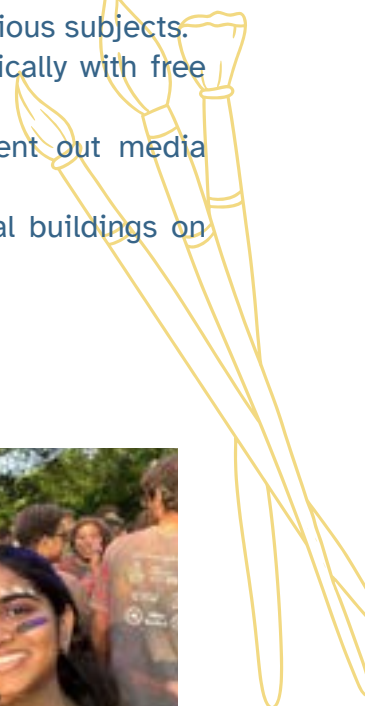
FITQ: *Friday in the Quad* is a gathering for Murts every other Friday, typically with free food, good music, and amazing friends.

Fondy: Fondren Library is a great place to study, conduct meetings, rent out media equipment, and many other things.

H&D: Housing and Dining is in charge of all food services and residential buildings on campus.

IM: Intramural: informal, low-stress sports played among students.

Jack: To pull a prank, usually on another college.

Vocabulary

KTRU: Rice's on-campus, student-run radio station.

Matriculation: Ceremony held during O-Week to officially welcome you to Rice.

McTriculation: Ceremony held during O-Week to officially welcome you to McMurtry.

McTeam: McM Core Team (Magisters, Resident Faculty Associates, Resident Associates, College Coordinator).

Murt: A resident of McMurtry College (YOU)!

OC (Off-Campus): People who live off-campus are referred to as "being OC." People who live far away from Rice, or seem to spend a lot of time outside the hedges are referred to as "deep OC."

Private: A party thrown by a group of people in a residential college, rather than the whole college. The rules and regulations are outlined by the Alcohol Policy.

Pub: Located in the basement of the RMC, Pub hosts sports nights, trivia nights, and Thursday night themed parties.

Public: Themed party thrown by a residential college open to any Rice undergrad. Most colleges throw one per year.

The Quad: McMurtry Quad is a gathering place for Murts to eat at the picnic tables, play soccer in the grass, or just hang out.

RMC: Rice Memorial Center is the home of Chaus, Student Success Initiatives, the Office of Academic Advising, and many other great resources.

Room Draw (Jack): The process we use to assign rooms for the next school year.

Sallyport: The huge archway in Lovett Hall. Once you pass through during Matriculation, you are not to cross through here until graduation.

Sammy's: Located in the RMC, it's a multi-purpose area that is regularly used as a study space or dining area for food stations located there, or repurposed as an event space.

Servery: The kitchen where your everyday food is made. Every college either has its own servery or shares one with nearby colleges (McMurtry's is West Servery).

Student Association (SA): Campus-wide student government.

Suite: The rooms that are shared by 5 or 6 Murts found near each of the stairwells.

Tea Nook: Student-run boba shop located in Sammy's in the RMC, open Tues-Thurs nights.

Town Hall: Biweekly meetings used to discuss various Murt events and policies, open to all Murts and their voices.

Beer Bike Week: The week preceding Beer Bike, filled with college activities, alumni, and plenty of jacks!

Y2K: The best 2000s-themed public party of the year held every February in McM Commons!

Yurt: McMurtry Commons named after its resemblance to the Mongol dwelling.

Beyond the Hedges

As the nation's most culturally diverse and fourth largest city, Houston offers endless opportunities for exploration. As a Rice student, you will have close access to the Texas Medical Center, the Houston Museum District, Rice Village, Hermann Park, and lots more!

Texas Medical Center (TMC): A 15-minute walk from Murt, the TMC is the world's largest medical center. A variety of biomedical and life science-focused labs host Rice undergraduates to conduct independent research, and there are many opportunities for hospital volunteering as well. The TMC is also home to numerous food establishments, including Starbucks, Chipotle, MOD Pizza, and many more.



Museum District: About a 20-minute walk or short metro ride from Murt, the Museum District is home to 19 museums, galleries, cultural centers, and community organizations, including the Museum of Natural Science and Museum of Fine Arts. The Museum District is a popular destination for Murts looking for a relaxing but fun weekend activity!



Rice Village: Located immediately west of campus, Rice Village is a 16-block bundle of boutique and chain stores, along with bars, coffee shops, and a variety of restaurants. Students frequently walk (about 20 minutes from Murt) or drive to this area to grab food, boba, drinks, etc. off-campus.



Hermann Park: One of Houston's oldest public spaces, Hermann Park is across the street from the North Colleges and consists of over 450 acres to host any outdoor activity you can imagine, including picnics, scenic runs, and sports! Some of the most popular points of interest are the Houston Zoo, the Japanese Garden, and McGovern Centennial Gardens--all of which you can get in for free with your Rice ID!
